Attendance

As Stated in the FCS Re-Entry Plan:

Students are expected to make every effort to attend their scheduled class times according to the remote learning instructional schedule. At the beginning of each class period, attendance will be taken by teachers based on a student's completion of the check-in process in Google Classroom.

- If a student is ill or unable to attend class virtually (doctor's appointment, family emergency, etc.), parents/guardians should call the school to report the absence per normal operating procedures.
- When a student misses an assigned class period, they will be counted absent. Students will be able to complete assigned work for the period of time they are absent.
- Attendance in PowerSchool remains the official attendance record of FCS.

If there is a question attendance the student should first communicate with the teacher directly. The teacher can determine if there was an issue and how to solve it. One of two actions will be taken.

1. If the teacher is able to determine attendance needs to be changed the teacher will contact our attendance secretary to have attendance corrected.
2. If the teacher is able to determine attendance was taken correctly and the student was absent a parent must call into the attendance line to excuse the absence. 317-346-8007
