
All State Choir



Virtual & eLearning Reminders

Virtual

- Students should enter the assigned Google Meet at the start of each period, following that day's bell schedule.
- Students should stay on the Google Meet until the teacher releases the class.
- Attendance is taken in real time.
- Staff members should be available to students during class time.

<u>eLearning</u>

- Lessons and all necessary information should be posted to Google Classroom by 9:00 a.m. on the day of an announced eLearning Day.
- In the case of a 2-hour delay that changes to a closing, instructions should be posted to Google Classroom by 11:00 a.m.
- Staff members should be available to students and parents for questions during school hours.
- For attendance and grading purposes, all students will have five school days after the eLearning day to complete and submit assignments.
- Work not completed on the actual eLearning Day is to be completed on the student's own time.
- Unlike a virtual school day, attendance is not taken in real time, student attendance will be submitted after the five-day eLearning window is complete.
- If a student does not turn in work for an assigned class at the end of five days it will be recorded as an absence for that class/day.
- When designing lesson content, some Internet based activities may be used. However, if a piece of instruction is reliant on the Internet, this should be clearly noted in the student directions and allows students additional time to access the content if Internet access is not available in the student's home.


Friday Funnies

There are also a few other scholarships available right now: The Johnson Co Extension Homemakers Memorial Scholarship, Northwood Elementary PTO Scholarship, JCREMC, and others! Make sure to check this Master Scholarship list weekly for new updates!

JUNIORS: The Horatio Alger Association Scholarship is now available until March 15th! This scholarship is for students who have overcome a great adversity and who also demonstrate financial need. It's a fantastic scholarship--up to \$25,000! Please visit their <u>website</u> to learn more and click <u>here</u> to apply.

JUNIORS: The Coolidge Scholarship is a nationwide scholarship that can pay for full tuition at your college/university of choice! It's also renewable for up to 4 years! Academic excellence is the primary criterion considered by the Coolidge Scholarship. Secondary criteria include an interest in public policy and an appreciation of the values President Coolidge championed. Successful candidates will also demonstrate humility and have a record of genuine service to their communities.

SENIORS INTERESTED IN EDUCATION-The Indiana Commission for Higher Education is now accepting applications for the Next Generation Hoosier Educators Scholarship. This scholarship provides up to \$30,000 in financial aid to aspiring teachers. Top-performing high school and college students who are planning to teach in the State of Indiana for at least five years can receive up to \$7,500 per year of college (up to \$30,000 total) from the scholarship. Interested students are encouraged to act quickly as there are only 200 scholarships available. Students should apply by Jan. 31, 2024, at ScholarTrack.IN.gov.
